From the Bimah: Our Rabbi's Message

Grace and I have spent an amazing week and a half in Israel, finishing

our Rabbinic mission this evening (February 1st) with Havdalah in Hostage Square in Tel Aviv. It has been a very emotional time to be here with 14 hostages coming home since we arrived. The joy and jubilation at their release weighs heavily on everyone whose loved ones are still waiting to be released and even more troubling for those not in the first 33 on the list to be released. The theme of our trip is Hope and Resilience. We had incredible meetings with people whose presence gives hope to everyone they encounter. Everywhere we went people could not stop thanking us for visiting Israel at this time. There are many American students taking a gap year or studying here and we also saw some Christian groups. It is so important for Jews to come to Israel to witness first hand what is happening here. It is so important to show support by coming here. I'm investigating putting together a week-long mission to Israel in May. If you are interested please reach out to me. I will be speaking about my experiences in Israel when I come to Hickory in two weeks and I look forward to seeing you. May you continue to pray for the return of the hostages.

Dear TBS Family and Friends,

Welcome to the month of Sh'vat, when we celebrate yet another new year! Tu B'shvat, often called the birthday of the trees, has come to be regarded as a time to reflect on the seasons, on our reliance on and need for trees to live, and in general for the planet's health. Did you know that, in some communities, it is the tradition during Tu B'shvat to eat 15 kinds of fruit — in addition to the seven species?! In most, however, we eat Israeli fruits (e.g., figs, dates, and carob) and snack on nuts, dried fruits, and other grains. Of course, we love the opportunity to taste a new fruit and say a Shechyanu!

Rabbi Liss and Grace have just returned from Israel and will share some of their stories and experiences from that trip with us when we meet for services on **Friday evening**, **February 14**, at **7:00** and **Saturday morning**, **February 15**, at **10:00**. We'll meet again at 6:00 for potluck dinner, adult Jewish learning, and Havdalah. Many of us have found these Saturday night gatherings to be especially meaningful. If you're over 18, please join us!

A highlight of our February "Rabbi Weekend" will be the Bat Mitzvah of Taliah Levy, daughter of Hannah and Jack Levy and older sister of Kendrah Levy. We look forward to sharing in this Levy family simcha on Shabbat morning.

Thank you to all who continue to bring cans or boxes of food to help fight food insecurity. Your donations are going to The Hickory Soup Kitchen. As you may recall, your Board of Trustees voted to make this a year-round project so please continue to bring a can or box of food every time you come to TBS -- and please make sure that the expiration date is at least six months out since your donation may be on the shelf that long. Only 5% of donations for food insecurity come from the private sector! Let's continue to take "leaps of action" by donating our cans/boxes to the Hickory Soup Kitchen.

Your Board of Trustees will meet on Sunday afternoon, February 16, at 12:15. A priority will be our ongoing efforts to secure our building and ensure our members' and visitors' security. Many thanks to our Security Team, co-chaired by Drs. James Norwood and Rhett Tompkins. As a reminder, if you have a key to the temple please turn it in to a member of the Security Team or the Board. Thanks!!

And thanks to Dr. Aaron Tosky who is collecting bids to inspect our roof. It's the original one, so it's time to check out what kind of shape it's in.

Israel's challenges continue. We are grateful that some hostages have been released, and we continue to pray that the remaining 79 hostages, held for more than 15 months, will be released soon. We continue to pay attention to and support Hillel as it gives Jewish college students a place to feel safe in their Judaism. Until all hostages are free and the savage war, we did not invite is over, I'll continue to repeat information as to sites we can visit to help our Israeli brothers and sisters and our college students.

The Harriet Sederholm Scholarship Fund (HSSF) was established by a long-time Temple member and past President, Burt Sederholm (may his memory be a blessing), to honor his late wife Harriet, who died shortly after she retired from 25 years with the Catawba County Department of Social Services. The scholarship committee is a sub-committee of the Temple Beth Shalom Board. The committee manages funds invested



to award one-time scholarships with the earnings from the invested funds. These awards honor the memory of Harriet Sederholm and her efforts to improve the lives of many impoverished adults and children in Catawba County.

The HSSF scholarship is available to students. Candidates will submit an essay to any one of the committee members. The essay will explain who the candidate is, what they are doing currently, their plans for the future, how the scholarship funds will be used, and, if applicable, what the connection may be to Jewish life.

The committee will make decisions based on the following preferences but not absolutes:

- Is the applicant a temple member or related to a temple member?
- Is the applicant Jewish?
- Will the funds be used for educational needs?

• Will the funds make a difference regarding the applicant's ability to benefit from the activity?

• Is the activity something deemed to be of value by the committee?

Interested students should submit their essays by April 30th. The scholarship season runs from May 1-April 30. All applicants will be notified in writing if their application has been approved or declined by May 15th. Awards should be mailed to recipients by May 31st.

The essay should be emailed to any of the committee members: Lin Gentry, Karen Ferguson, or Sandy Guttler. Naturally, the committee encourages everyone to make a tax-deductible donation to the Scholarship Fund at any time.


